Successful Completion of 7-Day NSS Special Camp – NSS Unit-1, Mihir Bhoj P.G. College, Dadri

Under the aegis of the National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit-1 of Mihir Bhoj P.G. College, Dadri, a 7-day Special Camp was successfully organized from 10th March to 16th March 2026 at Vijay International School, Roopwas Village, Greater Noida. The camp was conducted under the guidance of Programme Officer Mr. Shailendra Kumar, with the active participation of 50 NSS volunteers and 10 senior NSS volunteers.

The main objective of the camp was to develop social awareness, leadership skills, a spirit of service, and community participation among students. To achieve this, all volunteers were divided into five groups, each assigned specific themes related to important social issues.

On the first day, the camp began with an inaugural session, orientation, group division, and task allocation, where volunteers were introduced to the objectives and significance of social service. Each day started with a yoga session, conducted under the guidance of Mr. Pradeep Sharma (District In-charge, Bharat Swabhimaan), Mr. Dinesh (District In-charge, Yuva Bharat, Dadri), and Mr. Sanjeev Ji (President, Kisan Seva Samiti).

These sessions emphasized the importance of physical, mental, and spiritual well-being. During the camp, several distinguished guests visited and provided valuable guidance. Traffic Police Officer Mr. Kapil Dhama created awareness about road safety. Ms. Aditi Bharadwaj, a National Wushu Player, All India Inter-University Medalist, and Khelo India Women League Medalist, along with Dr. Garima Bharadwaj (Ayurveda and Naturopathy expert, Face Yoga Instructor, Dietician, Chiropractor, and Acupressure Specialist at Auram Swasthya, Greater Noida), conducted a self-defence training workshop for the volunteers.

These sessions provided a platform for expression, reflection, and renewed enthusiasm.
